How do Christians show love to others?

Now that I am back, I do want to remind us all of the agreement we passed in 2018 for our social media policy (see below). It's wonderful guidelines for all of us, especially as others outside of church wonder how Christians live. Remember the Peter Scholtes' hymn "They'll know we are Christians by our love"? What does it mean for us to text, email, post on social media and even talk with others in a loving way? Remember to stop and T.H.I.N.K. which means:

- T= Is it true? Is the information you are sharing true? Has it been posted by a reliable and reputable news source? If you are posting an opinion, does your opinion appropriately represent the values and mission of Faith Lutheran Church?
- H= Is it helpful? Does the information you are sharing help further the mission and values of Faith Lutheran Church?
- I= Is it inspiring? Does the information you are posting inspire, inform, and/or improve Faith Lutheran Church's community engagement on social media?
- N= Is it necessary? Is the information you are posting necessary, or is it better left unsaid? In other words, be aware of the content and be careful not to spam the social media and web presence of Faith Lutheran Church with unnecessary information.
- K= Is it kind? What is your motivation for communicating, and are you aware of how your message is coming across?
- Martin Luther's Explanation of the 8th Commandment. A helpful guideline for online engagement is Martin Luther's explanation of the 8th Commandment. Luther writes: "The Eighth Commandment. 'You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.' What is this? Answer: We are to fear and love God, so that we do not tell lies about our neighbors, betray or slander them, or destroy their reputations. Instead we are to come to their defense, speak well of them, and interpret everything they do in the best possible light." (Trans. Timothy J. Wengert, Augsburg Fortress, 1996).

Matthew 18:15-20

"If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one.
